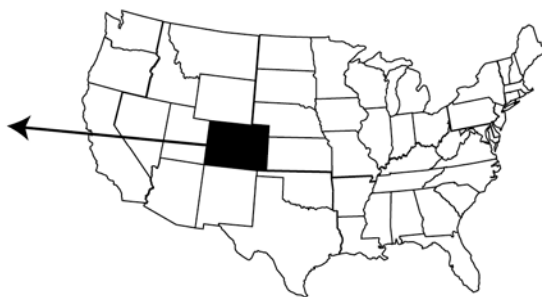
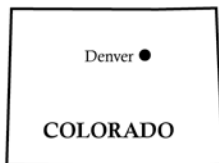

Climate

Colorado has mild and mostly dry weather. Summers are warm during the day with very little rain and cool evenings. Spring and Fall are mild and dry. There are occasional heavy snowfalls, although winters are generally dry and cool. Cold days are quickly followed by warm temperate days. There are more than 300 days of brilliant sunshine annually. Denver has four seasons of outdoor recreation.

✓ Housing Check-in and Departure

Legacy Heights - Westminster

Rooms (standard option): **Doubles (2 person)**

Shared bedroom, in two-bed, 2 bath off-campus apartment. Each apartment is fully furnished, air-conditioned, a TV/VCR with cable, free local phone and Wireless Internet hook up. Linens are also included. Students clean their own rooms during their stay. 2 pools, a fitness center, a business center with high-speed Internet are on site.

Meals Included: **None** - A supermarket is next door. Fully equipped kitchen and dishes are provided. Students may purchase meals at college cafeteria or utilize many affordable restaurants in the area.

Age Minimum: **18+ years old**

Laundry Facilities: Self-service machines are available in the apartment complex for a small fee.

Security: Limited access entry and courtesy patrol. Maintenance supervisor resides on site.

Check-In: **12 noon to 5:00 pm (Sunday) check-in**

Students with confirmed reservations report to Legacy Heights rental office. A welcome letter with key and instructions will be waiting. Students who arrive late or have difficulty can call the Sunday arrival toll free number noted further below. Students with reserved Airport Pick-up may check in at other times, before 10:00PM.

Damage/Key Deposit: \$100 damage / key deposit.

Checkout Time: 11:00 am (Saturday).

🏠 Homestays

Rooms: **Single (1 person)**

Meals Included: **16 per week** (daily continental breakfasts and dinners with lunches added on weekends)

Age Minimum: **16+ years old**

Flight Information: Homestay students should notify ELS of their flights and arrival times so that families will know to be home when they arrive.

Transportation to ELS: Some students arrive by bus and others live close enough to walk. A few families drive students to and from the campus.

Check-In: **9:00 am to 9:00 pm (Sunday) check-in**

Students go directly to homestay address.

Checkout Time: 11:00 am (Saturday)

➔ Airport Arrival Information

Other Transportation Options From the Airport:

Taxis from the airport to the campus or homestays will cost approximately \$60-\$70 plus \$10 tip, with a travel time of about 40 minutes. Students staying in a hotel upon arrival may be able to take their airport shuttle directly to the hotel by exiting the baggage claim area, but this should be confirmed in advance.

Center Arrival Information

New Students should report to the ELS Denver Center **between 8:00 am and 8:30 am on the first Monday** of their program for registration, the ELS placement test and orientation. New students need to bring the following items:

- Passport (plus I-94 card & I-20 form - if applicable)
- Funds to pay tuition and housing and other relevant fees (or receipt showing pre-payment)
- Proof of medical insurance (or funds to purchase ELS insurance)
- Materials contained in the acceptance package
