<b>Campus Size:</b>	225 acres
<b>Location:</b>	The University is located midway between Los Angeles and Santa Barbara, nestled against the ruggedly beautiful Santa Monica Mountains yet just 14 miles inland from Malibu. Thousand Oaks is home to 127,000 people and consistently ranks as one of the safest cities in the USA.
<b>Climate:</b>	The southern California climate is famous for mild winters and warm, dry summers. CLU's location near the Pacific Ocean means that cool, foggy mornings are quite common.
<b>Student Body:</b>	2,196 undergraduates; 1,303 graduate students
<b>Average Class Size:</b>	15 students
<b>Faculty:</b>	139 (fulltime), 85% with terminal degrees, 0 Teaching Assistants
<b>Student/Faculty Ratio:</b>	15:1
<b>Athletics:</b>	NCAA Division III; <i>Men's</i> intercollegiate sports include baseball, basketball, cross-country, football, golf, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, water polo. <i>Women's</i> intercollegiate sports include basketball, cross-country, softball, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and water polo.
<b>Campus Features:</b>	15 fully-wired co-educational (by floor) residence halls divided into suites with private bathroom.  More than 70 clubs and organizations represent a wide variety of academic disciplines as well as athletic, recreational, multicultural, political, social, religious and service oriented pursuits. Student government, campus media, drama and musical groups provide additional opportunities for involvement.  Facilities include a Student Union, Coffee House, Bookstore, Library, Science Center, Center for Instructional Media, Sports & Fitness Center with Dance Studios, Aquatics Center, Baseball Stadium, Football Stadium, Tennis Complex with 15 courts, Soccer Stadium, Track & Field Facility.
