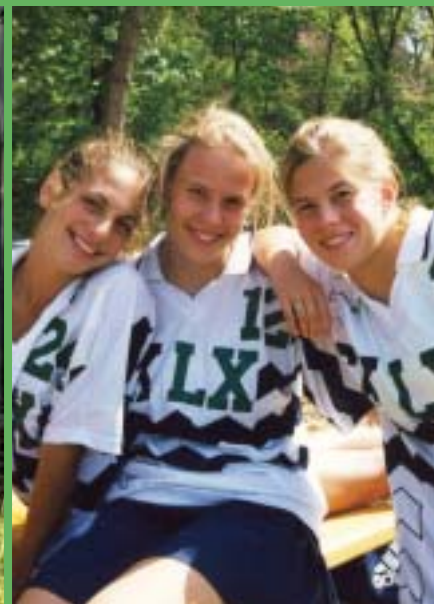

Fast Facts

Founded:	1922
Location:	Located in a residential suburb approx. 1/2 hr from Detroit, Cranbrook Schools' 315-acre campus has been called "a masterpiece of American architecture." The Schools' buildings, gardens and fountains were designed by a world-famous architect and are part of the Cranbrook Education Community which also includes Cranbrook Institute of Science and Cranbrook Academy of Art. The entire Cranbrook complex has been designated a National Historic Landmark.
Climate:	Temperate. Snow in winter
Student Body:	Co-educational, boarding and day; 540 students, 250 boarding, 100 International students.
Average Class Size:	16 students
Faculty:	93 (56 with Master's Degrees; 12 with Ph.D.'s) 80 Faculty/Administrators reside on campus
Student/Faculty Ratio:	7:1
International Student/ESL Program:	The ISP fosters personal and academic growth and helps integrate students into all aspects of Cranbrook life. Various activities throughout the year provide an opportunity for students to share their cultures with the rest of the school while forging connections with local culture and communities. In addition, a Mentor program pairs a seasoned Cranbrook student with an international student and a Host Family program provides students with an opportunity to experience American home life and a welcoming environment during vacations and holidays if necessary. Cranbrook's ESL program is offered to students with strong academic records, a minimum of three years of English study and in interest in moving quickly into the mainstream academic program. ESL classes meet five days/week with a maximum of 8 students/class.

Campus Features:	Adjoining campuses of unsurpassed beauty are within walking distance of each other. Boys live in the Cranbrook dormitories, girls at Kingswood. Both have dining and common rooms, meeting places and libraries. Students attend classes and take advantage of facilities on both campuses. Shuttle buses provide easy access throughout the day. Additional facilities include a science center, performing arts center, music building, dance studio, fine arts studios, two complete gymnasiums, weight & fitness room, stadium & track facility, 15 all-weather tennis courts, bowling alley, numerous playing fields, and an indoor swimming pool.
Extracurricular Activities:	Students are encouraged to start their own interest groups and to become involved in a variety of organizations and committees that influence the quality of life at Cranbrook Schools. Presently, there are more than 30 student clubs and activities including yearbook, newspaper, literary magazine, theater, debate, science, and computer.
Marking System:	Comprehensive grade reports are sent to parents two times a year as well as two interim progress reports during the first year and for students who need them thereafter. Students meet with their advisors at least twice/month.
Accreditations:	Cranbrook School is accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Central States and is a member of the National Association of Independent Schools.
