To graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 18 academic credits distributed as follows:

(including biology)

- Computer Studies 1 year

Honors & AP Courses

Advanced Placement courses are available in eight subject areas as are Honors sections in English, Mathematics and History.

Special Academic Programs

More than 20 electives are offered, including human anatomy and physiology, environmental ethics, world religions, international relations, psychology, photography, web page design, computer programming, and architecture.

The college/university counseling process begins in grade 11. 100% of graduates went to university in 2004, including institutions such as Tufts University, Purdue University, St. Lawrence University, North Carolina State, Assumption College, and Colby College.

Extracurricular Activities: 28 Varsity and Junior Varsity teams, student government, student proctors, student ambassadors, Diversity committee, yearbook, art & literary magazine, student newspaper, drama group, acappella singing group, orchestra and chorus, jazz band, string ensemble. Individual music lessons are available.

Marking System: Advisors provide grade and progress reports for parents seven times a year, after two weeks of school and thereafter at the midpoint and close of each trimester.
