Program of Study

To graduate, students must successfully complete a minimum of 23 academic credits including:

English.....	4 full units
Mathematics.....	3 full units
Science.....	3 full units
Social Studies.....	3 full units
Fine Arts.....	2 full units
World Language.....	2 full units
Physical Education.....	2 full units
Health.....	1/3 unit
Electives.....	3 2/3 full units

Other required courses are:

Computer Literacy. Students complete the balance of required credits through trimester electives. Fifteen hours per year of community service are also required.

Honors & AP Courses:

Honors courses in: Biology I and II, Physics I and II, Earth Science, English, World History.

Other Honors & AP courses available upon request.

AP courses in: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, English Literature, European History, French Literature, Physics B, Spanish Language, Statistics, U.S. History.

In addition, there is an opportunity for qualified students to take classes at nearby Franklin and Marshall College. Advanced music students also may audition to take instrumental classes at the Pennsylvania Academy of Music in Lancaster, PA.

Special Academic Programs:

Extensive programs in the Arts, including visual arts, dance, drama, music, musical theatre, stagecraft, video, web design etc.

College Placement:

Linden Hall's philosophy is to custom fit a match between a student and a college with a goal of maximizing both academic success and personal growth. Graduates go on to colleges or universities including institutions such as American University, Boston University, Bryn Mawr College, Drexel University, MIT, New York University, Penn State University, Pratt Institute, Smith College, Trinity University, University of Chicago, University of Michigan.

Founded: 1746 (Linden Hall is the oldest girls' boarding school in the USA.)

Location: Lititz, PA is a historic and charming small town located in the lush farm land of Lancaster County, noteworthy for its beauty and convenient access to nearby Philadelphia, Washington, D.C., and New York City.

Climate: Temperate. Some snow in winter.

Student Body: Boarding and day grades 6–12 and PG; approx. 125 students; 25% international

Average Class Size: 8–10 students

Faculty: 25 full time

Student/Faculty Ratio: 5:1

ESL Program: Linden Hall School offers a comprehensive ESL Program that includes courses in Beginner & Advanced ESL. Science and History are also included in the ESL curriculum.

Athletics: The School fields varsity teams in basketball, equitation, field hockey, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. The Riding Team competes in the Tri-State Equitation league and hosts five horse shows each year. Non-varsity physical activities include aerobics, skiing, swimming, skating, bowling, running, and dance.

Campus Features: Linden Hall's beautifully landscaped 47-acre campus includes an equestrian center with indoor and outdoor riding rings, tennis courts, playing fields, and picnic areas. Indoor facilities include a swimming pool, a new sports and fitness center with dance and exercise studios and a new arts center with a theater, art gallery, art classrooms, kiln room, photography class room, and darkroom.

Extracurricular Activities: Student Council, Photography, Journalism, Drama, Hand Bell Choir, Chorus, Crafts, Literary Magazine, Yearbook. Music lessons and dance instruction also are offered.

Marking System: Comprehensive grade reports are sent to parents 6 times a year. Students meet frequently with their advisors.

Accreditation: Linden Hall is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
