Wellness by the Water

In September 2012, George Brown College will be opening the doors to its new waterfront campus, a state-of-the-art facility that will house all of George Brown's health sciences programs. This new building will accommodate 3,500 new student spaces across the college, including 1,000 in the college's Schools of Dental Health, Nursing, Health Services Management and Health & Wellness.

The new waterfront campus is designed to provide students with interdisciplinary education through a range of innovative learning environments, including an Interprofessional Learning Clinic and a Health Promotion Hub, where students will have the opportunity to test various means of caring for patients and conduct applied research that will enhance the field. Moreover, the new campus will allow students to

experience the realities of health care delivery in Ontario by providing inter-professional health care services to residents in the surrounding East Bayfront community.

The campus will also serve as a hub to the East Bayfront community, offering residents green space, as well as access to fitness and recreation, all housed within an environmentally sustainable building that meets the gold standard in Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED). Over the course of the construction phase, the project generated 1,750 new jobs.

St. James Campus

George Brown College's St. James Campus is located in downtown Toronto, between Richmond Street to the North, King Street to the south Sherbourne Street to the East and George Street to the west.

Five principal buildings are located at 200 King St. East, 215 King St. East, 290 Adelaide St. East, 300 Adelaide St. East and 230 Richmond St. East, and are home to the following George Brown College Schools:

Casa Loma Campus

George Brown College's Casa Loma Campus is located in midtown Toronto, between Davenport Road and Dupont Street to the north and south, at the corner of Kendal and Macpherson Avenues.
